Terror drives social media crackdown

SOCIAL media giants will be forced by the government to decrypt messages between terrorism suspects amid fears they are allowing attacks to be plotted in secret online.

Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull will today ancompel Facebook, Google

and other technology companies to co-operate and hand over data in urgent counter-terror operations.

The Herald Sun can reveal nounce tough new laws to online encryption has hindered more than 90 per cent

of high-priority inquiries by Australia's spy agency.

Just last month it hampered more than 60 federal police operations involving terror and organised crime.

Security agencies will also get new powers enabling them to use surveillance technology to spy on suspects

through their devices, potentially allowing them to track encrypted chats in real-time.

"Encryption is vital for information security, but the privacy of a terrorist must never trump the personal security of Australians," Mr Turnbull told the Herald Sun. **CONTINUED PAGE 6**

A short history of nearly everything

HINK you've seen
everything?
Think again.
If you have not yet
visited MONA
(Museum of Old and New Art)
in Tasmania and inspected its
latest show, The Museum of
Everything, then you have not
seen a banjo papered with
cigar-box art or a coffin
sculpted from river clay or an
ornate desk crafted by a
former slave.

"Most people would not have encountered the material we're showing," says curator James Brett. Certainly not in mainstream art museums.

While The Museum of Everything provokes big questions about what art is and who might be called an artist, its carnival-like MONA exhibition teems with little dramas as well.

Love and loss, sex and death, ghosts and guns ... its all here at MONA, almost 2000 artworks by over 100 art makers juxtaposed in lots of domestic-scaled rooms.

Brett explains: "This is the private life of art, an exhibition

that proves — once and for all — that art is not from the outer reaches but from within."

Brett, a Brit with a background in film, founded *The Museum of Everything* in 2009 as a "wandering institution for untrained, unintentional, undiscovered and unclassifiable artists of the 19th, 20th and 21st centuries".

So when visionary Australian art collector David Walsh suggested *The Museum* of Everything stage an "epic 10month drama" at MONA, to coincide with the opening of last month's Dark Mofo winter festival in Hobart, Brett leapt at the opportunity.

"MONA is a strange and wondrous place," he says. It's also big enough to accommodate what has become the largest international exhibition of "non academic art" ever staged in Australia.

Brett says "it's the best installation we've ever done", even if he and Walsh differed over the use of signs.

"David has a strict no-sign policy for MONA exhibits," he says. "The Museum of Everything, on the other hand, thinks you can never have too many of them." The pair seem to have reached a happy medium. A sign of the times. **HIGHLIGHTS**

LOTS OF LAUGHS BUT JUST MISSES BEAT

NOISES OFF

NOISES Off by Michael Frayn is a rollicking, English farce about a play-within-a-play that goes completely off the rails both on the stage and behind the scenes.

Noises Off bounced onto the London stage in 1982 with its boisterous physical comedy and cleverly constructed comic narrative, then Frayn repeatedly reworked the script for ensuing seasons.

Sam Strong's production, with its talented ensemble, is partially successful in delivering Frayn's verbal and physical comedy, eliciting big laughs when actors forget lines, get drunk, fall over, drop their trousers or lose props.

Each of the three acts of Noises Off contains the first act of a deplorable, amateurish, bedroom farce called Nothing On.

Firstly, we witness a disastrous dress rehearsal, then backstage mayhem during a matinee and, finally, a performance near the end of the tour in which everything that can go wrong does go wrong.

The opening scenes are very funny, particularly with Louise Siversen hilariously switching accents and physicality as Dotty, the addled star of *Nothing On*, who in turn plays chatty housekeeper Mrs Clackett.

Simon Burke is suitably pompous and sarcastic as

Lloyd, the director of Nothing On who is having it off with despondent assistant stage manager Poppy (Emily Goddard), and with ditzy, shortsighted Brooke (Libby Munro).

Hugh Parker captures the vibrating anxiety of needy actor, Freddie, and Nicki Wendt has an entertainingly wry quality as sensible Belinda, who unsuccessfully mediates offstage conflicts and desperately tries to save the show onstage.

Ray Chong Nee performs a comically daring slapstick tumble down stairs but is not always credible as cockney Garry, while James Saunders captures the frantic edginess of Tim, the overworked stage manager, and Steven Tandy is effectively daffy as Selsdon, the boozy, elderly actor.

The classic farce elements of Frayn's play demand tight cuing, impeccable comic timing and a relentless pace, but this production loses its rhythm.
